Re-innovating Unity of Mesa

IT'S ABOUT MORE THAN RENOVATING A ROOF—IT'S ABOUT MOVING FORWARD!

Unity of Mesa is called to change in physical, financial, operational & internal ways to strengthen our spiritual community. In order to Raise the Roof and Raise the Funds, we will Support Staff & Teams while we Raise Our Spiritual Vision.

Our Sanctuary roof truss system dropped on December 21, 2014 and is in need of complete replacement. On February 22, 2015, Unity of Mesa's membership authorized additional church indebtedness up to \$300,000 for repair and restoration of the Sanctuary, and other priority renovations.

WHICH RENOVATIONS ARE WE PLANNING FOR?

Recognizing that plans are subject to engineering issues, permit processes, final pricing, and contingencies, the following renovations have been identified as priorities:



Preliminary Timeline: 4 weeks for Sanctuary design & permits. 10-14 weeks construction. Interior Main Building projects done while Sanctuary under construction; exterior afterwards. Annex projects not to disrupt classrooms while Main Building meeting spaces are limited.



HOW WILL WE PAY FOR THIS?

We are abundant! A mix of short-term and long-term fundraising, along with prudent borrowing, will help us cover what we need without jeopardizing our future. If insurance kicks in, we will gratefully accept that, too!

Fundraising & Borrowing

Money needed in the next 4 months exceeds general giving in a year.
Wise fundraising involves raising additional funds for facilities, without

diverting general funds for ministry programs, staff and operations. That's why requests for donations are "above your regular giving."

Whatever we borrow has to be paid back, but rates are historically low and it gives us 5-10 years to raise the money. We also spread costs over years and different congregants who will benefit from the improvements. Estimated monthly loan payment will be \$2,000/month.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR STAFF & VOLUNTEER TEAMS?

We have been thin on staff for several years, and down a staff position since July when Peg went on sabbatical and retired. We were planning to reorganize and hire after the holidays anyway. With renovations, fundraising and off-site services added to full plates, it's critical that we improve communications and volunteer support while streamlining staff responsibilities.

Rather than making construction and fundraising our main focus, we are positioning ministers, staff and teams to continue providing quality spiritual education, services and pastoral care while we Reorganize Operations renovate.

Individuals do not need to be
congregants. Funds are not
needed immediately, but
indications of interest
requested by March 16
to determine whether to
continue with bank financing.
